These are just some of the questions that get asked throughout the day leading up to 3:25. Once the special guest arrives in the class, he or she is greeted with seven enthusiastic young boys cheering, clapping, and vying for the closest spot to the special chair. The mystery reader has arrived and its time to read.

So what is a Mystery Reader? Well, Mystery Readers are special guests who come to our classroom to read a story to students. Mystery Readers can be parents, grandparents, older siblings, or other relatives. But wait, why do you do it? Students love to see their parents, grandparents, and special friends get involved in the classroom. The Mystery Reader program allows anyone who wants to become involved because it requires little time, but the memories will last forever for the surprised students!

Aren't the boys a bit old for this? 
